



Rules for using the outdoor heated tub

Dear Guests,

for your comfort and relaxation in both summer and winter, we have installed an outdoor hot tub. We would be happy for you to use it, but please do so with the following rules in mind so that the tub will last in good condition for you and other guests.

1) The hot tub may only be operated by persons over the age of 18 who have read these rules.

2) Put the insulating lid on the bucket when heating and after bathing to reduce cooling of the water. The insulating cover must be handled by at least 2 persons.

3) Before lighting a fire in the stove, remove the ashes (put them in the compost) and always check that there is 15 to 25 cm of water in the tub from the top, so that all nozzles are submerged below the water level. If there is less water, refill it and only then light the fire. **Not enough water in the tub will cause permanent damage to the tub and the stove when heated!** Check the water temperature regularly on a floating thermometer and keep the tub covered with a lid. Use preferably pieces of cardboard and thin dry chips of soft wood for ignition. Smoke will start coming out of the chimney when it gets hot, which can take several minutes. Do not overfill the stove so that the wood does not fall through the barrier on the right side. Every 30 minutes, turn on the air massage system for 20-30 seconds to mix the water. When the temperature reaches 33°C, stop adding wood to the stove, the water will finish heating itself. It takes approximately 2.5 hours to heat the water from 20°C to 37°C.

HEATING PROCEDURE

1) The recommended bathing water temperature is 37° to 42° C. Do not exceed 45° C, as the filtration system may be damaged.

3) If water suddenly starts to leak from the tub, e.g. due to a defect, extinguish the fire in the stove.

4) The Jacuzzi air system may only be used for a maximum of 30 minutes at a time, after which it must be switched off for at least 30 minutes, after which it may be switched on again.

5) It is forbidden:

a) using sharp objects in the tub (glasses, jewellery, watches, etc.)

b) emptying the water from the tub

c) jumping into the tub (refilling the water can only be done manually with a bucket)

6) Take a shower before bathing in the tub.

7) Keep the wooden floor in front of the tub clean and do not walk on it in your shoes.

8) Make sure babies have a bathing diaper.

Control:

On the top of the tub there are 2 circular buttons to control the lights (one press - the lights change, double press - you can choose the light you like) and the Jacuzzi air massage system

We check the hot tub before the guests leave. Any damage caused by violating the above rules is the responsibility of the person who took over the chalet and the hot tub.
